Habitat: The Pyramidal Cypress is native to the eastern Mediterranean, found in Greece, Libya, Türkiye, and Cyprus. It can also be found in temperate zones of the Northern Hemisphere.

Leaf type: evergreen, scale-shaped, green, and small.



Height: They typically measure between 20 and 30 meters, althoughoccasionallytheycanreach42meters.

Flowering: They bloom in late winter and spring.




Description: A tree with a long and thin trunk and grayish bark. It has thin, cylindrical, green branches. It has green leaves and high-germinating seeds. It grows rapidly, lasting 10 years.



Culinary applications: Cypress is used medicinally to relieve the feeling of heaviness in the legs and is also used to improve blood circulation. Its wood is used for making wooden figures and for carpentry, and it was formerly used in shipbuilding because of its high-water resistance.



Information: The pyramidal cypress is normally seen in cemeteries, this is due to an ancient tradition of Greece and Rome, this because according to mythology thanks to its shape it sent the deceased to heaven, and its evergreen leaves symbolized the eternal.
